THINGS TO DO



Soak up the College atmosphere

Visit the world-famous Kings College.

Not only can you enjoy the picturesque gardens and riverside, but you can step inside the centuries-old chapel, where concerts and the annual Christmas Eve service are broadcast.

Take in the view

Climb the steep 123 steps of the Great St Mary's Church tower and enjoy a 360° panoramic view of Cambridge. Great St Mary's is the official University Church, and is notable for hosting Stephen Hawking's funeral in 2018.

Tickets for the tower are £6 for adults and £4 for children (age 5-16), £16 for a family ticket (2 adults + 2 children). Under-5s go free. Tickets are for sale in the Church gift shop. Reservations are not required.

Visit a Museum

The most famous and distinctive museum in Cambridge is the Fitzwilliam Museum, where you can see a masterpiece and explore the extensive collection of art and antiquities belonging to the University of Cambridge.

It is free to enter and reservations are not required.

Relax in the Botanic Gardens

TAKE TIME FOR A DRINK IN A CAMBRIDGE PUB

Cambridge is home to over 110 pubs so there really is one to suit every person and every occasion! Here are some of our preferred establishments...

The Eagle

8 Bene't St, Cambridge CB2 3QN

Dating back to 1667, this is one of the oldest pubs in Cambridge. Seeped in history, this is the place where in 1953, Francis Crick publicly announced that he and his colleagues had "found the secret of life" when they discovered the structure of DNA.







10 Peas Hill, Cambridge, CB2 3PN

You will find a wide selection of craft beers and many interesting gins. If you're hungry it also has great food (including the quintessential Scotch egg).

The Mill

14 Mill lane, Cambridge, CB2 1RX

A classic riverside choice which, in addition to great beer and pub grub, offers plenty of outdoor space to unwind.



The Anchor

Silver St, Cambridge CB3 9EL

This iconic riverside pub is a stone's throw away from the famous Mathematical Bridge, and was a favourite local haunt to the members of Pink Floyd in the early 1960s.

The Punter

3 Pound Hill, Cambridge, CB3 OAE

Only a few minutes' walk from Robinson college, this cosy pub offers a warm and welcoming atmosphere. We recommend booking a table, as it always fills up quickly!
